



### Fueled Customs Body Shop

Lake Mills, WI - This truck began life as a University of Wyoming campus utility vehicle, and after one more owner was bought for \$900 while Eric was attending WyoTech College in Laramie, WY. The truck had to be towed by chain back to where Eric was living in Laramie due to some questionable tuning by the previous owner (the truck had lawn mower spark plugs just to name one issue). While attending WyoTech the truck was taken apart, lifted, painted and fitted with a stock LS motor, this was in 2003.

12 years later Eric decided it was time for a transformation, bringing the truck down to the ground and converting to 2 wheel drive, as well as some major chassis work and upgraded to a newer, more powerful LS motor. The transformation took around 2 years and involved a lot of late nights and weekends at the shop. There are countless upgrades and customizations that make up this build. This truck has taken home some trophies since being finished, was featured on Hot Rod's web site in October 2018, and a feature in the February 2019 issue of Classic Trucks Magazine.

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# The FBI Galaxie

I first saw this car in Illinois in April of 1996. It was for sale but I didn't buy it.

One day in July of 2012, I got a phone call from a friend. He said a man approached him at a cruise night and asked him if he'd like to buy a 1963 Galaxie. My friend wasn't interested in a 4-dr so he passed the owner's information on to me. I called and made arrangements to see the car in Watertown. The car was significantly different than when I saw it 16 years earlier. The engine was out of it and in pieces - some in the interior and some in the trunk. The transmission was also out. Other parts of the car were scattered about in the car as it was partially disassembled. At one time someone had painted the car a dark red. Most of the red was stripped off (except in the more difficult locations to access like the door jambs) and the exterior was now a mixture of green, red and two colors of primer. It was not a pretty sight.

As I looked the car over, I had a feeling it might be the same car I saw in '96. When I got home I checked the VIN against the one I had recorded from the Illinois car and found it was indeed the same car. I called the owner and told him I would pass on it. He asked me for an offer but I didn't want to insult him with a lowball price. He said any offer was okay, so I made an offer. Much to my surprise, he accepted my



offer. On July 14, 2012 my friend Steve and I

brought the car home.

Off and on I worked on some pieces of this car that had been sandblasted by the previous owner. In mid October of 2012, I started to concentrate on the restoration of this car. I removed the front end and painted the firewall. The rain gutter caulking was dried up, so I removed all of it and re-caulked them. When I stripped the roof, I found the dents I had remembered seeing when I first saw the car in '96.

Next I painted the front suspension parts. Then I started working on the right side doors. Both doors looked so solid and straight that I figured I would just have to prime them and paint. However when I stripped the paint, I found bondo and lots of it! Both doors had creases from the front to the back. (Surprisingly, the fender and quarter panel weren't creased at all.) I worked the metal as best as I could to use as little bondo as possible. There was a little bit of rust which I also repaired.

Through the winter and spring, I worked on the dashboard and front end suspension parts. I removed the red Oklahoma dirt from one of the lower

A-arms and almost filled a half-gallon container.

In June of 2013 I started stripping the ugly red paint that was all over the door jambs. Using a toothbrush and lacquer thinner, I spent over 8 hours on them.

The left side doors were next. They also looked good until I stripped the paint and, of course, the bondo. The rear door was so bad that I decided to replace it rather than fix all of the dents and rust. The front door was good enough to use after some work.

Next came the hood. It had bondo on top and ugly red paint on the underside. Then İ stripped the right fender. It had a little rust and a dent with (again) way too much bondo. The left fender was pretty good and needed only minor work. I found that the car had originally been equipped from the factory with a fendermounted remote-control sideview mirror (that's where they were mounted on 1963 Galaxies). This car though, currently had a Thunderbird remote-control mirror mounted on the door. It was changed was because of the spotlight.

After stripping the paint and bondo from the deck lid, I found that it was pretty

beat up so, I replaced it. Next, I started working on the right quarter panel. Like everything else, it looked good initially. But it had dents and the rust repair work done on it was poor. Portions of the inner quarter panel were also rusted away and I had to make the repair panels for those areas. The left quarter panel needed some straightening and rust repair too. The right side rocker panel was pushed up as if someone had run over a curb.

When it was all said and done, there wasn't a panel on the car that hadn't been fixed with bondo. When I bought it, I thought that all I needed to do was to strip, prime and paint the car because it looked so straight and solid. What a surprise.

When I purchased this car I also got the original sales receipt (not a copy) from the Department of Justice to its second owner (a private citizen). It shows that this car was in service with the FBI until it was sold in October 1968. When I dropped the gas tank out from under the car, I found the original build sheet on top of the tank. The build sheet confirmed that this was a "U.S. Government Unit" and also showed that the gas tank was undercoated.

I know that this car came with two radios. The Motorola brand of police radios that were used in 1963 had only one channel. So, one radio was for the FBI's frequency and the other radio was for the local police frequency. The evidence for those two radios included holes: 1) in both sides of the trunk floor for the radios, 2) in the top of the quarter panels for the antennas, 3) in the dashboard for the radio controls and microphones, and 4) in the two places where the speakers were mounted. When the FBI removed this car from service, they also removed all of the radio equipment. Fortunately, over the years, I had purchased the pieces that I needed in anticipation of possibly restoring some 1963 Fords that came with this kind of equipment. Finding





the location to mount the controls was easy because I matched the radio control bracket holes to those in the dash. I had noticed that there were small holes in the heater box. Those holes matched the speaker bracket holes so I mounted one speaker there. While installing the

ashtray, I noticed a square hole in the top of the ashtray framework. When I mounted the first speaker I noticed a square hole in the bracket. I realized that the second speaker was mounted on top of the ashtray (using a carriage bolt) and it faced upwards. The sound from that speaker came through the factory speaker cover on top of the dash.

When I removed the rear seat I found three sets of seat belt eyebolts like those used for the front belts. When the customer ordered them, Ford dealers usually installed two belts in the rear using a nut/bolt/big washer combination.

My brother Jim and I reupholstered the seats using some NOS covers I had found. The original interior was like that found in regular production cars,

except that the seat frames/ springs are heavier duty.

The engine was messed up by someone and I had to have some machine work done before rebuilding correctly. My friend Steve handled the rebuild. The transmission was in rough shape and needed rebuilding also (the transmission fluid looked like 90-weight oil). Charlie at ATD rebuilt that part.

I pulled the rear end gears out in order to drain and replace the differential fluid. There wasn't much fluid in it to drain out but the whole bottom of the housing was filled with sludge. Like so much of this car, it was ugly.

This car obviously had a rough life. Hopefully the days ahead will be easier now in its retirement.


